

Space For Live Art

New Moves International is delighted to announce that they are part of a successful application for a Culture 2007 funding award.

Following the success of part one of Space for Live Art that took place in 2006 with partners Les Halles in Brussels and Les Subsistances in Lyon the decision was taken to expand the partners and length of the project.

The last 18 months has been one of many applications and budget submissions as well as finding partners that will allow the project to deliver a full and diverse programme of events that include festivals, co-commissions and productions, workshops and residencies.

The additional partners are

The project will run for five years and will be coordinated by Les Halles, who will take responsibility of maintaining a website for the project as well as overseeing all necessary reporting.

A logo for the project will be designed by June and all partners will approve this and carry on their websites and all promotional materials.

The project has a global budget of €4,107,750.00 and over the five years the aim is to present the following by the partners.

- 605 Performances
- 76 New Commissions
- 45 Co-Productions
- 43 Talks/Debates
- 41 Workshops
- 50 Performances by young European performers (YEP!)
- 65 Residences
- 26 Public Art Performances

All the partners will document the project; NMI will continue to do this in the same way we currently do with the NRLA Archive held at Bristol University. There will be a separate archive created for A Space for Live Art and the purpose is to establish a European Live Art centre archive.

In year 5 the project will issue a publication that will contain iconology, texts and an overview of the five years and this will be published in English and

French and will be launched at the opening of an exhibition that will be curated to celebrate the project.
